Guidelines for entering the competition

- Entries must be no more than 1000 words
- Entries can be handwritten, word-processed or e-mailed
- Entries can be an essay, story, poem or diary entry
- Entries may be written in English or Welsh
- You must be in Year 6 (leaving junior school this summer)
- You must go to a school in the City and County of Swansea
- Entries must relate to one of the following subjects:

My Summer, My Team, My Swansea or My Wales

I give permission for my entry to be used in publicity material for The Dylan Thomas Prize, its educational programme DylanEd, and by the City and County of Swansea.
